PUPIL PREMIUM GRANT EXPENDITURE

2016-2017

Harlington Lower School receives a Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) from the government – based on the number of children receiving free school meals, looked after children or children with parents in service. The grant may be spent for the educational benefit of pupils registered at that school, or for the benefit of pupils registered at other maintained schools; and on community facilities, for example services whose provision furthers any charitable purpose for the benefit of pupils at the school or their families, or people who live in the locality in which the school is situated.

Nature of support 2016-2017

The funding received from the Pupil Premium is being allocated in the following ways:

- Learning Support Assistant (LSA) to deliver bespoke 1:1 and small group work in phonics, reading, writing, mathematics, social skills and pastoral support
- Additional intervention support provided by class based TA; 1:1 and targeted group based work in phonics, reading, writing and mathematics
- Increased Lunchtime Assistance for Early Years to offer a range of support for individual children at unstructured times of the day
- Curriculum enrichment giving access to extra-curricular activities including residential trips, clubs and music tuition
- Provision of balanced nutritional meals in order that pupils are ready to learn
- Provision of school uniform to raise confidence and self esteem
- Teaching staff to attend phonics training courses for 'Soundwrite'
- Continue Assertive Mentoring programme to improve pupil engagement in their learning and for pupils to know their next steps
- Purchase additional resources to enhance learning opportunities eg guided reading books

Curriculum focus for PPG spending 2016-2017

- ❖ The provision is aimed at closing the gap between children in receipt of Pupil Premium and their peers
- ❖ Supporting pupils in literacy and mathematics with a focus on core basic skills – especially skills such as phonics, sentence work, spelling, grammar, early reading and early number work.
- ❖ Supporting pupils in reading with a focus on comprehension.
- ❖ Confidence in problem solving limiting mathematical progress.
- ❖ Developing self-esteem, core learning skills and confidence in identified pupils to enable them to access the curriculum more fully as a whole.

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

The school will evaluate the impact on each pupil at the end of the Autumn, Spring and Summer terms. Evaluation will focus on academic achievement and self-esteem as a consequence of the intervention. On-going tracking and rigorous monitoring by the Senior Leadership Team and class teachers will ensure the most appropriate interventions are fully in place.

Our PPG expected for 2017-2018 is £6208 (7 months)

Future Plans

- Sustain work from previous year.
- Increase English and mathematics intervention via 1-1 teaching sessions.
- Continue to offer precision teaching for improved reading and spelling.
- Observations and shared practice for "sounds write" lessons
- Target pupils to take up After School Clubs
- Target pupils to take up music tuition
- Enable targeted pupils to take part in extra-curricular activities
