Daily Routines: The children will now enter the school via the side entrance in the mornings and this is also where we will stand with the children at the end of the day as they wait to be collected. The register will be taken at 08:55 each morning. Our first lesson begins at 9am and it is important that children are in school ready for the start of that lesson.

Reading Books: As usual, reading books will be sent home daily. Please try and ensure that your child brings their reading book into school everyday, regardless of whether or not you were able to read with them at home the previous evening. Whenever you do hear your child read, a short note in their reading diary about their reading, retelling and understanding would be very useful. Once a book has been read and your child has spoken to an adult in school about the book it will be changed. Little and often is still the preference for reading at this age.

Library : We will go to the library on a Monday each week and the children will be able to choose from our fantastic range of books in school. Please encourage your child to bring in and change their book each week.

P.E: We have PE lessons on a Tuesday and Friday. Please ensure your child has the appropriate **named kit** in school at all times, including shorts, t-shirt and plimsolls or trainers. If your child has their ears pierced, please ensure that they are able to remove the earrings themselves, if they cannot, they must bring in tape to cover their earrings.

Homework: Each week your child will bring home spelling words to learn and they will be tested every Monday. It is important that they learn to spell these words in order to improve their spelling knowledge. Your child will have a piece of English and maths homework on alternate weeks, given on a Friday and due in the following Thursday. Please encourage your child to do their best when working at home.

Snacks: Children in Year 3 do not have a piece of fruit provided by school. They may bring in a piece of fruit or vegetables from home to eat at playtime. Please avoid the dried, coated packets of fruit.

Water bottles: Children should drink throughout the day, therefore please send a named water bottle into school each Monday so that your child can have water in the

Topic Information for Parents
