- Learning through teacher directed tasks






#### Curriculum

# Monitoring Progress

- ► Baseline; National
- Observations made electronically; photos, videos, samples of work
- Directed task work kept for files
- Termly checks of taught sounds, taught maths and writing independently
- ► Each area of learning has its own set of 'Early Learning Goals' which determine what most children are expected to achieve by the end of Reception Year

#### Lunch

Our school meals are provided by Caterlink. Caterlink are "passionate about fresh, healthy food that tastes great. The right nutrients can affect everyone's mood, behaviour, health, growth and even their ability to concentrate. Encouraging a well-balanced diet establishes healthy eating now and for the future".

- Meals are currently free for every child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2





#### Uniform

We take pride in being smart, well presented and ready for learning. We believe children should feel a sense of pride in being a member of our school community. It is our Academy Trust policy that all children wear school uniform when

attending school.



# Pupil Premium

Pupil Premium funding is designed to support those children who are deemed to be from a disadvantaged background. Money is given to schools to enable them to target specific support to improve outcomes for this group of children. The funding is triggered by the following:

- ► A child is currently eligible for free school meals, or they have been during the last six years
- ► A child is currently in the care of the Local Authority, or they have been during the last five years
- ► A child has a parent currently serving in the armed forces

#### School readiness

- Encourage your child to be independent
- Getting dressed by themselves; zips and buttons, socks and shoes, coats and gloves
- ► Eating with a knife and fork; having a go at slicing food into smaller pieces
- Unpacking their book bag
- Managing their own personal hygiene; going to the toilet and washing their hands, using a tissue for their nose
- Playing turn-taking games
- Sharing
- Recognize their own name; peg, tray, snack card, labels in uniform
- Attempt to write their own name, using a capital letter to start, followed by lowercase letters
- ► Talk about playtime, assembly, lunchtime and any worries that they may have
