
Beech Class


We have had a fantastic half term in Beech Class!

In English, we read a book called Escape from Pompeii which is all about the eruption of Mount Vesuvius. We have enjoyed reading about what it would have been like for people in Pompeii and what happened to the city after the eruption. We particularly enjoyed watching videos of volcanic eruptions and learning lots of interesting facts about volcanoes in our reading lessons. Our independent writing was incredible as we worked so hard to include fronted adverbials, rich vocabulary, accurately punctuated speech and paragraphs.


History has also been one of our favourite lessons because we have been learning about the Romans. We found out about the Roman invasions of Britain, Boudicca's rebellion, Hadrian's wall and how Roman roads were built.

In Art we have been exploring the work of many different artists all based around the topic of 'Insects'. We have developed our drawing skills in both pencil and colour and created some outstanding pieces of insect art.












In Science, we have been investigating solids, liquids and gases, learning about how the particles move in each state.
