Class Routines and Information

Homework: Your child will continue to bring home spelling words each week to learn. They will be tested on these words each Friday. Please encourage your child to do their best when working at home.

Water Bottles: Children should drink throughout the day, therefore please send a named water bottle into school each Monday so that your child can have water in the classroom at the end of each lesson. The water bottle will be sent home on a Friday to be washed and returned to school the following Monday.
