Daily Routines: The children will continue to enter the school via the classroom door in the mornings. We will use this door throughout the day. The children will put away their belongings and wash their hands before we take the register and begin our lessons.

Reading Books: As usual, reading books will be sent home daily. Please try and ensure that your child brings their reading book into school everyday, regardless of whether or not you were able to read with them at home the previous evening. Whenever you do hear your child read, a short note in their reading diary about their reading, retelling and understanding would be very useful. Please continue to ask your child relevant questions for the book they are reading. The skills of prediction and retelling are very important. Therefore we would discourage children from reading a whole book in one evening. Little and often is still the preference for reading at this age.

Library : Rowan class will go to the library every Thursday. The children will be able to choose from our fantastic range of books in school. Please encourage your child to bring in and change their book each week.

P.E: PE lessons will continue on a Monday and Friday. Please ensure your child has the appropriate **named kit** in school at all times, including shorts, t-shirt and plimsolls or trainers. If your child has their ears pierced, please ensure that they are able to remove the earrings themselves, if they cannot, they must bring in tape to cover their earrings. The PE kit will stay in school in your child's locker.

Homework: Each week your child will bring home spelling words to learn and they will be tested every Monday. It is important that they learn to spell these words in order to improve their spelling knowledge.

Children are expected to read their class reading book at least 5 times a week. This is monitored in school. The maths homework grid will be updated and will be sent home at the beginning of the term. Please sign each box once your child has completed an activity.

Snacks: Children in Year 3 do not have a piece of fruit provided by school. They may bring in a piece of fruit or vegetables from home to eat at playtime. Please avoid the dried, coated packets of fruit.

Water bottles: Children should drink throughout the day, therefore please send a named water bottle into school each Monday so that your child can have water in the classroom. We have limited space in the classroom therefore we would ask you to use the water bottle that can be purchased from the office rather than larger ones. Water bottles will come home on a Friday for washing.

Topic Information for Parents

English

Journey—Aaron Becker (Fiction Adventure)

Children will learn to write an adventure story based on 'Journey' using the language of Berlie Doherty. They will continue to use the present perfect form of verbs in contrast to the past tense as well as, use prepositions, conjunctions and adverbs to express time, place and cause.

Children will group related ideas into paragraphs and use a or an according to whether the next word begins with a vowel or a consonant.

The Merchant of Venice— William Shakespeare (Playscript)

Children will plan and write a guide for visiting The Globe Theatre in London considering key features from The Merchant of Venice.

Children will build an increasing range of sentence structures. In non-narrative material,

use simple organisational devices including headings and sub-headings to aid presentation.
